North Durham Nature

North Durham Nature Presents: Will our Songbirds Survive? with Erica Nol

Erica Nol, from Trent University, will share her research that looks at how songbirds are coping with human built landscapes. She and her graduate students have spent many days observing birds in forest and grassland habitats. Their methodologies rely on careful observation in the field, food availability, food traps and nest searching. Erica's research on Lesser Yellowlegs is being used to inform an initiative called Road to Recovery, a program designed to identify specific threats to bird species and guide collaboration between scientists and communities.
